

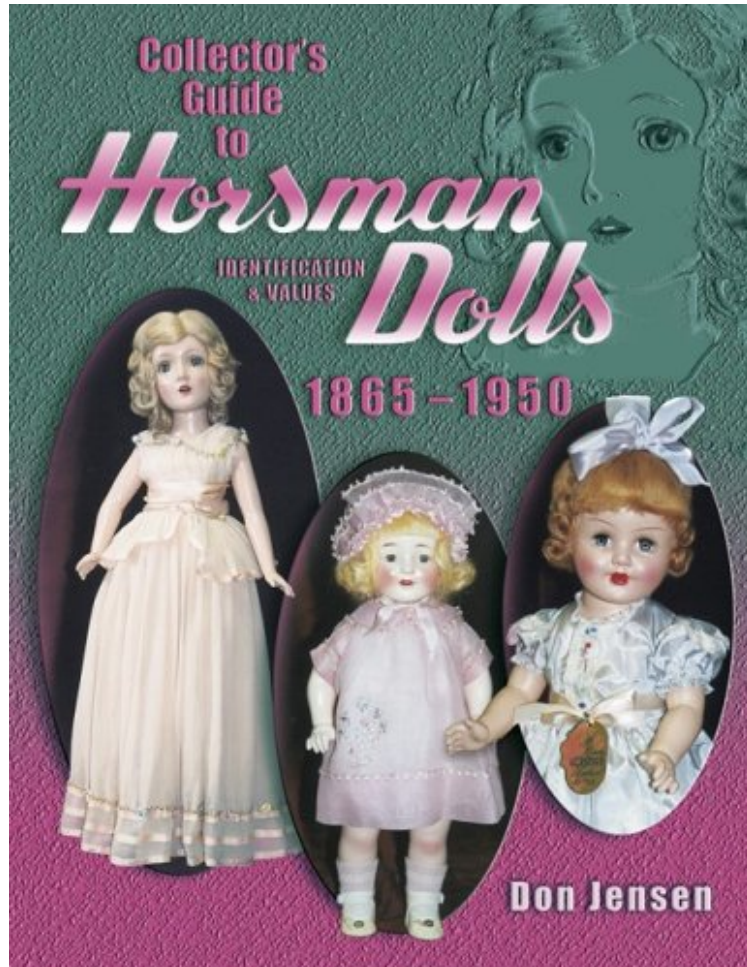

The photos come from many different sources, so their quality varies widely. I'm not referring to the old catalog illustrations; their sometimes poor quality is understandable. I'm talking about the photos of the dolls themselves. Some are crisp and clear, while others suffer all the problems of amateur photography: grainy, out of focus, too much flash, etc. This reduces their usefulness.
