

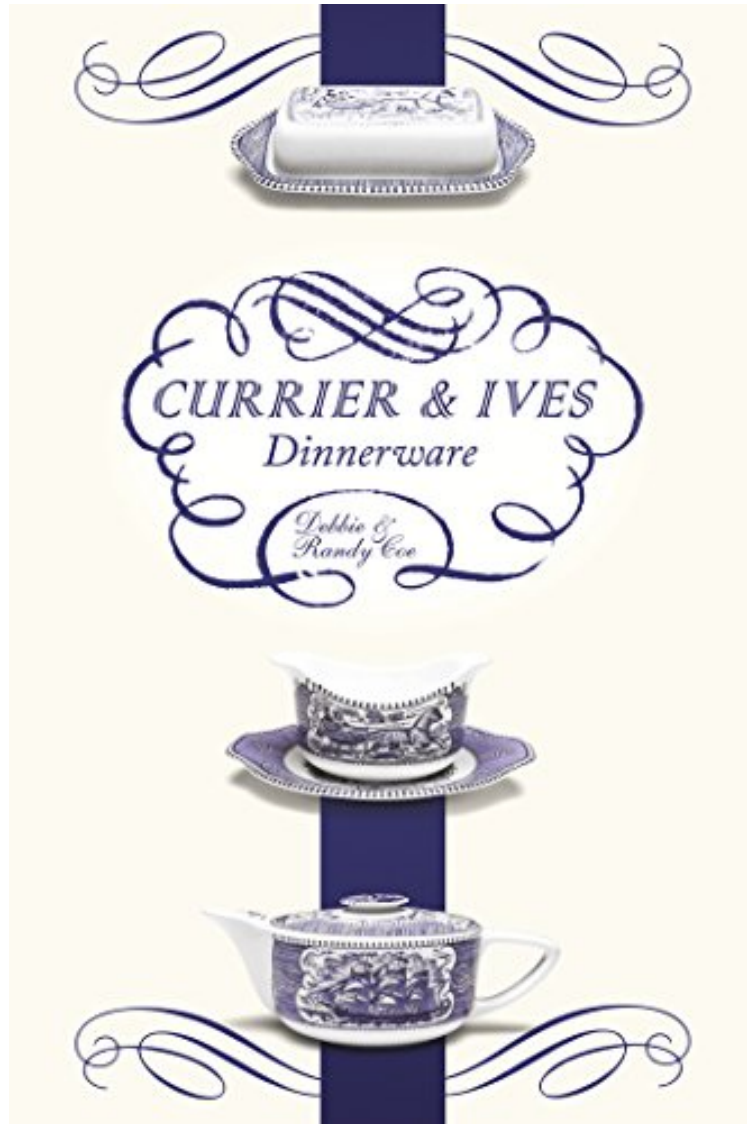

There were at least four more pie bakers than illustrated. More than just one version of the salt and pepper shakers, not to mention several more versions and sizes of mugs, mixing bowls, and many other pieces. I thought the book would be all-inclusive, but there just is not that much more to it than in an earlier book from many years ago. I thought the listed prices were greatly

exaggerated as well. Standard eBay prices are by far lower than the retail .com resource referenced in the book. I was also surprised not to see the small company that currently makes some unusual (pie birds, egg cups, rolling pins, etc) Currier Ives pieces in the traditional blue and white pattern. If a past company that produces 'go withs' can be featured in the book, why not a current-day producer of pieces in this pattern? Long story short: there is a lot more out there than in this book.
