

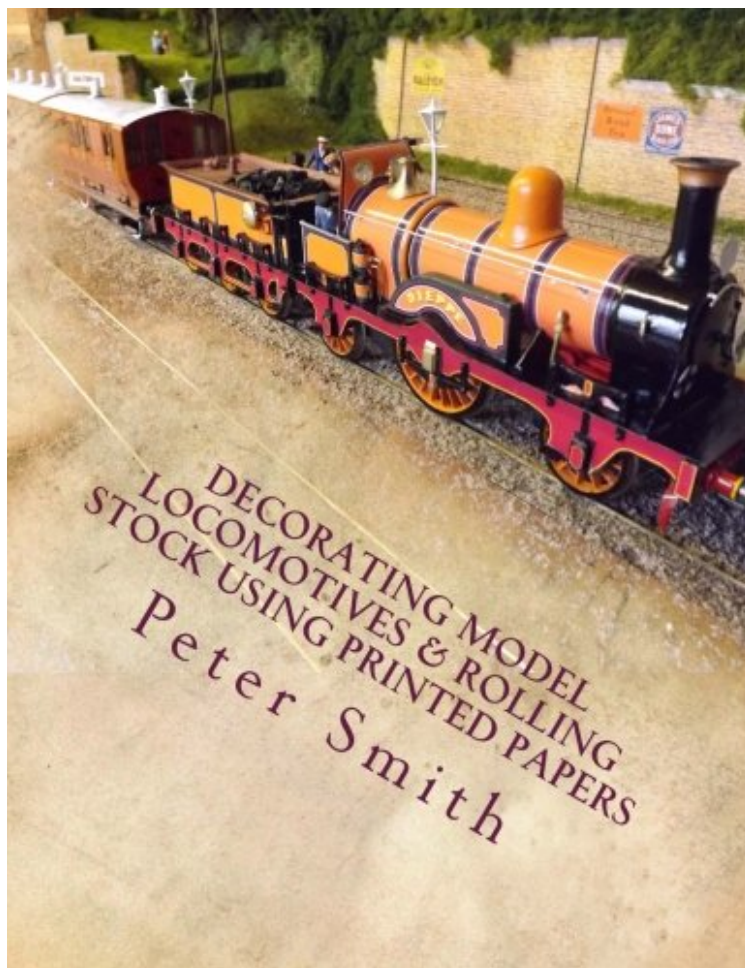

Painting model locomotives and rolling stock is a difficult skill to master. This book shows you how to do it a different way, using little paint but printing the livery on paper using artwork produced using a simple to master computer

program. The books takes you through the whole process, beginning with basic open wagons, through more complex goods stock, PO wagons, coaches and finally locomotives, including altering RTR models. Printed paper is a simple to use, cheap and flexible medium. If you think using paper is old fashioned, think again - it's state of the art!
