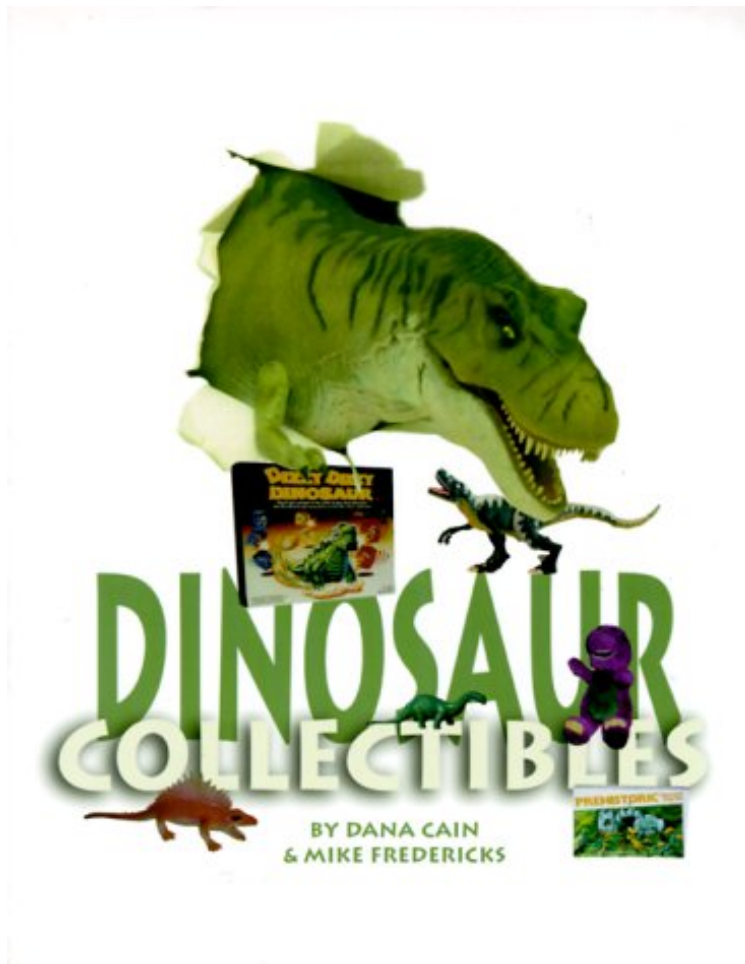

By StevenWell, this is a nicely produced book - glossy pages, colorful pictures - and it is the only one of its kind that I know of. However, having said that, I gotta admit that for the die-hard collector there is a lot missing from this book. Many of the makers have very little descriptive information, a line or two, and some don't even include the year(s) of manufacture. There is little in the way of "interesting" info - for example why and how did the MPC figures come to copy so closely the Marx designs? But there is a separate chapter just on Marx and that's a plus! There is a lot missing because this book was published in 1999 - so nothing at all on Papo for instance, or CollectA - and the info on Wild Safari, Bullyland, Schleich, etc. is pretty puny. And the suggested values are mostly out-of-date. The sections on Movies is fair - but the "Paper Dinosaurs" chapter is pretty thin! Barely anything covering comic books or vintage books about dinosaurs ... But for us collectors it's pretty much all we got for now! Will look forward to an updated new edition! In the
