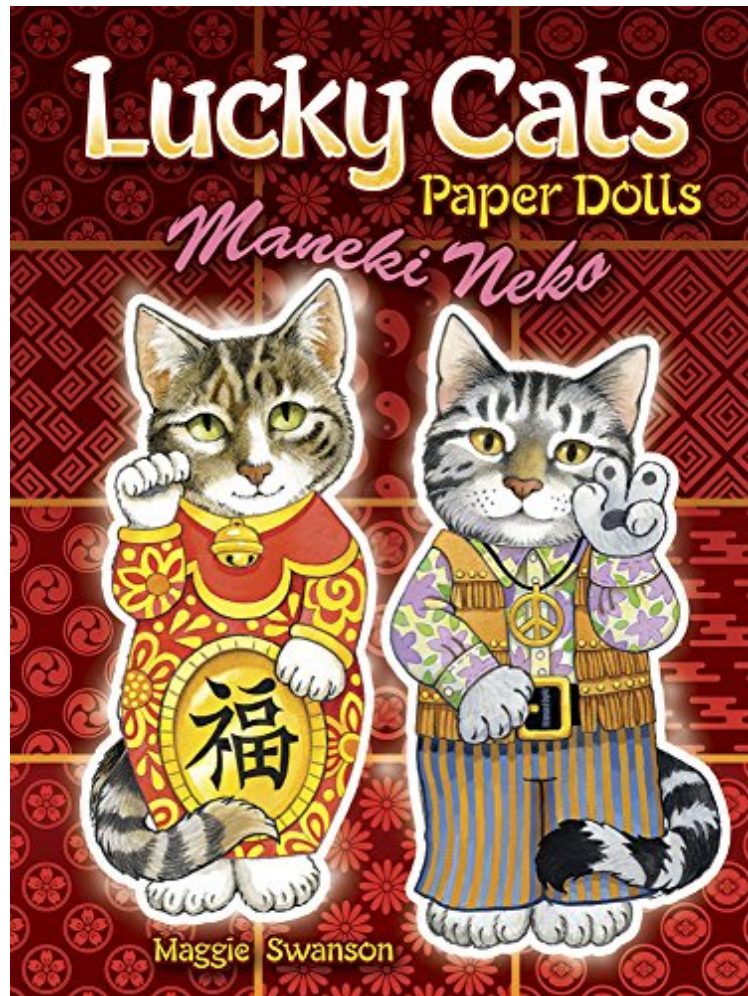

Hard to use as "paper dolls"...those insane rectangular tabs just never work well. I cut them out with an exacto knife (remove the tabs), stick onto magnetic sheets

and finally...a paper doll/cat situation that lets you dress cats. (At your own peril, of course). There is also a double page of stickers in the middle (cats similarly illustrated, though not as big. The paper cut-out cats are about as big as shown on the cover and each sheet has a theme with accessory items relating to the theme. Each theme tends to relate to cat lore in history, so there is an Ancient Egyptian theme, a Japanese theme, an English Garden theme (a tribute to Miss Potter, I imagine).
