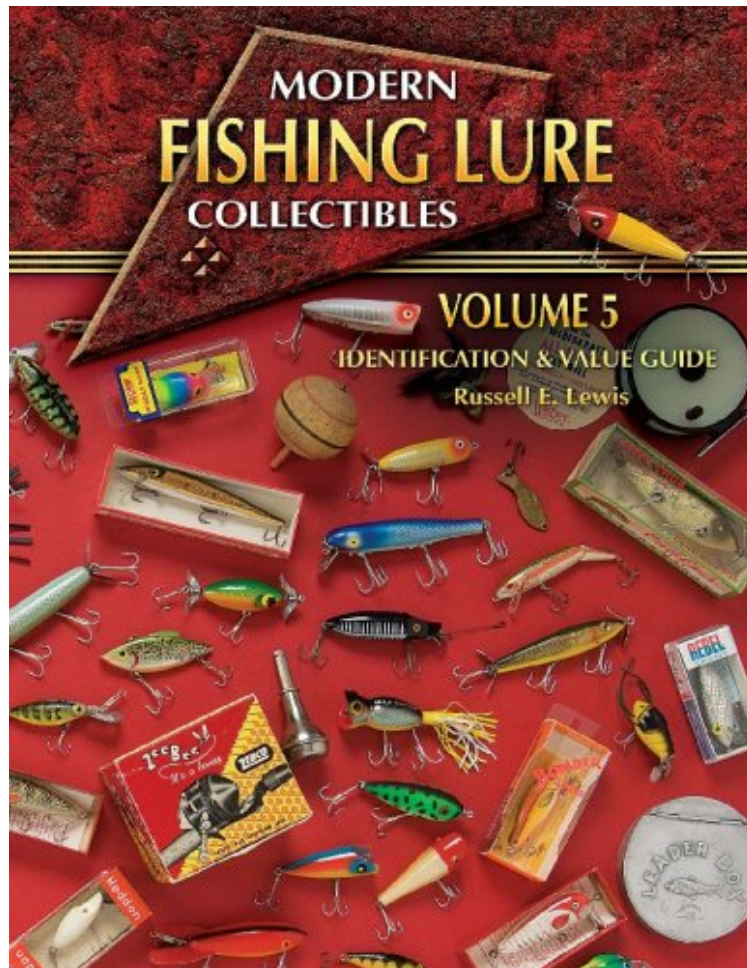

Large, crisp photos, realized values, and company histories are once again components of this essential encyclopedia for collectors. It continues the author's tradition of discussing companies others have forgotten or offering more details on companies already known. Hot collectible lures from the modern era are discussed and any corrections or additions to earlier volumes are included. Expanded manufacturer information and new companies are highlights of the book, and the index is once again a useful component. A selected tour of 1972 to 1987 is a special chapter of the book, as well as full details on 1986: A Year in Review. Heddon lures from 1972 to 1987 are given coverage, as are modern fish decoy carvers. Nearly 1,500 photos and 2,000 lure illustrations, including dozens of lure color charts never before published, make this a perfect companion to the author's other books. 2007 values.

Just released from Collector Books is the fifth volume Modern Fishing Lure Collectibles. It is also the final book of that very excellent series by Russell E. Lewis. Volume 5 covers mainly items made in the United States since 1940. Additionally it offers information on the changing mature of the fishing tackle industry, and the consequential closing of most companies in the early 1980s. About the Author Russell E.
