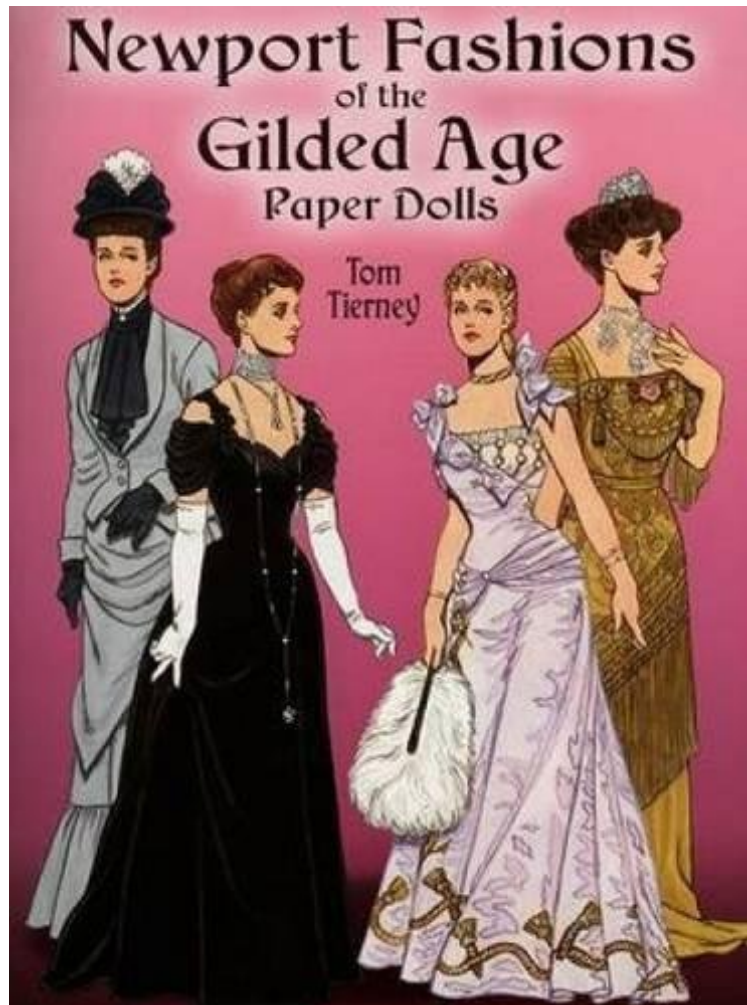

The size of this book is LARGER than the other two(Great Fashions of the Victorian Era and Gibson Girls). I must say I truly like the larger 12 x 9" size much better. It is only a matter of a few inches, but frankly it makes a big difference. The dolls are much larger and, naturally, so are the costumes. If someone was going to use these for playing "paper dolls" it would certainly making cutting out their costumes much easier to have the larger sized dolls.

In this book, he only puts two outfits on each page - when he does that in the other books, the costumes are rather small. In some cases, he could only put one dress on a page.
