

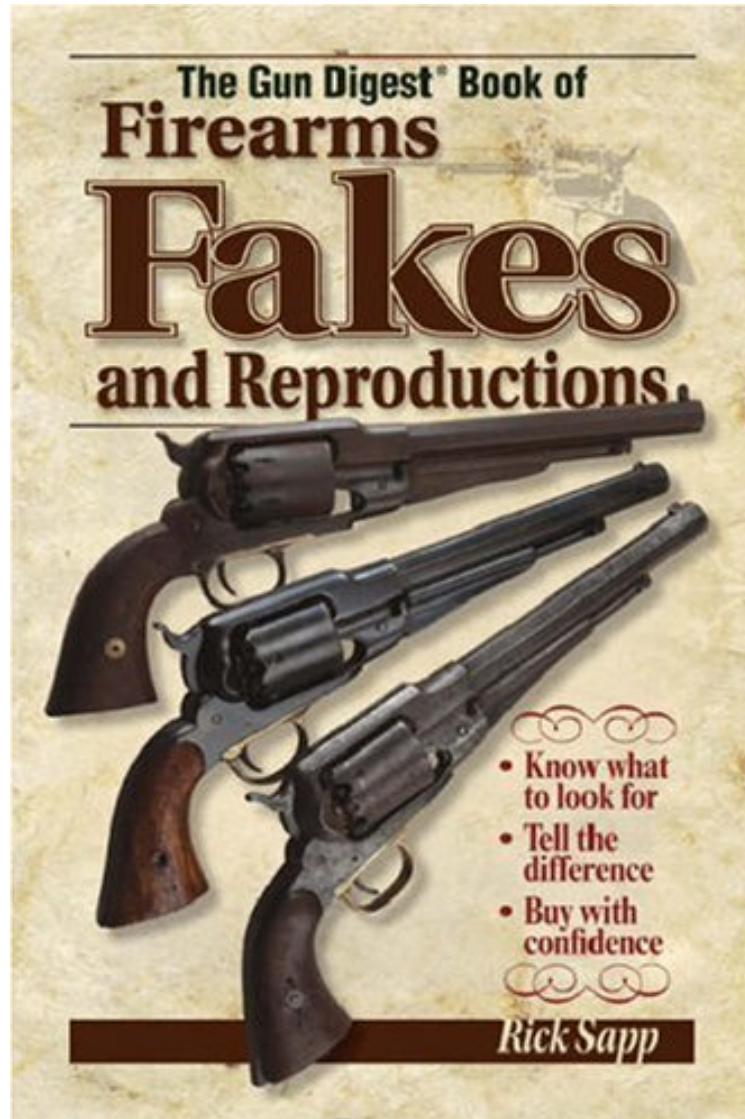

Chandel While interesting to the collector and having a lot of information about reproductions, I didn't find the book useful as a guide to identify fake or altered firearms. There was a picture of an obviously non-matching screw on one gun, and warnings about "buyer beware," but it wouldn't find it useful as a guide to identifying fake firearms aside from very rudimentary advice about check for "dishing" and some general advice about looking inside the gun for matching parts, wear and finish, but very little about how to do that. Also there was a lot about there being fake marks on guns, but so what? Very little about how to identify those. Most of the book was about replicas - if you are looking for a guide to spot fakes, I think you'll find this book to be "vaporware."

Firearms collectors and traders don't want to get 'burned!' With interest in buying and selling these extremely collectible guns at an all-time high, fakes and misrepresentations, and downright fraud has become almost commonplace in this industry of high profits and motivated buyers. Even the expert buyer can be fleeced by these incredibly involved and accurate forgeries, but with "The Gun Digest [registered] Book of Firearms Fakes and Reproductions", the buyer and bidder will know exactly what warning flags and giveaways to look for, and will have a complete understanding of just how these expensive guns are faked and altered.
