At \$15, I didn't even think twice about this book not knowing that it

is only 40 pages! It's merely what it says it is on the title ... a catalog. If getting stale information written like a catalog appeals to you, then this book/pamphlet is for you, but if you're used to the DK Lego books (like I am) which come with a minifigure and a bunch of colorful pictures and descriptions, then you will be sorely disappointed. I'm not saying that it's a bad book, but as far as price/value I feel that it's waaaaaaaay overpriced for what you get. Knowing that this author's other catalogs are more along the lines of 200 pages, perhaps it could have been priced more accordingly. The information inside the book is acceptable, but it's also something that a little online research would give you. I would wait for this book to be on sale before purchasing.
